About this guide

The aim of this guide is to provide an overview of the VET Knowledge Bank and timelines. This guide covers:

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VET Knowledge Bank

The <u>VET Knowledge Bank</u> is a suite of products that tell the story of VET in Australia. Together, they capture the diverse, complex and ever-changing VET system and is a memory bank of VET reference information.

What's in the VET Knowledge Bank?

Included in the VET Knowledge Bank are:

- a chart mapping the VET sector showing the paths individuals take through the VET system, as well as the drivers and enablers that contribute to the process
- a timeline of VET programs and policy initiatives from 1998-2023 that may have influenced participation in VET courses, apprenticeships and traineeships, at national, state and territory levels
- timelines that track major milestones in the history of VET, federal legislation relating to VET, and the key players who govern VET
- links to essays, theses, reports and books about the history of VET in Australia
- key landmark documents that have influenced and shaped the national VET system
- highlights from federal, state and territory budgets that relate to skills and training
- listings of current and historical VET-related organisations and resources
- the Glossary of VET

History of VET Trace the story of VET in Australia through timelines and key publications.



Policy initiatives Locate information about VET policies, programs and initiatives, and their funding.



Governance and regulation Access information about who governs and regulates VET in Australia



Landmark documents Explore the evolution of VET in Australia through landmark documents and historical overviews.



Organisations and resources Discover key Australian research organisations and useful VET resources.



Glossary of VET Understand the terms and acronyms used in Australian VET.

Navigating around the VET Knowledge Bank

The VET Knowledge Bank logo appears on all the VET Knowledge Bank pages. Click on the logo to return to the VET Knowledge Bank homepage.



Some of the VET Knowledge Bank products have multiple resources in them. These are provided as links on the 'parent' product pages and 'breadcrumbs' are provided on the individual resource page to navigate to the parent product.

Example

The **Getting to know VET** (parent) page provides information about the Australian vocational and education training system. It also includes 'Overviews' including:

- Apprenticeships and traineeships
- Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)
- Provider peak bodies
- VET funding
- VET pathways



The 'Apprenticeships and traineeships' link, for example, opens a new page. This page displays the breadcrumb at the top of the page, indicating that the 'Apprenticeships and traineeships' page sits under 'Overview' page, which sits under the 'Getting to know VET' page – these breadcrumb links allow you to navigate back to these pages:



Good to know: Links to some resources are provided on more than one product page. The breadcrumbs take you to the main product to which it belongs. You can also use your browser's back button to return to the previous page.

VET Knowledge Bank timelines

There are currently six timelines in the VET Knowledge Bank:

• <u>Australian VET policy initiatives</u>

This timeline helps you understand the scale of change and the individual policies, programs or initiatives that have shaped VET at both the national and state and territory level. See page 5 for tips on using this timeline.

From MINCO to CISC

This historical timeline captures the different Council of Australian Governments (COAG) Ministerial Councils responsible for education and training and their committees and advisory bodies between 1992 to 2020.

- <u>Governing VET in Australia</u>
 This timeline shows the Prime Ministers, Federal ministers and the Commonwealth departments responsible for skills and training in Australia.
- <u>Landmark documents</u>
 This timeline shows the key documents that have influenced the development of Australia's VET system.
- <u>Milestones in the history of VET</u> This timeline highlights key events in the history of VET.
- VET legislation

This timeline lists past and current federal legislation for VET in Australia.



Timeline of Australian VET policy initiatives


This timeline shows national, state and territory programs and policy initiatives since 1998.

Tips on using the Australian VET policy initiatives timeline

The timeline can be filtered by jurisdiction and category. Multiple jurisdictions and categories can be selected. To remove the filters applied, double click on the cross at the top right of the screen. A description of the categories is available under the timeline.





To view more information about an event, **hover** over the event. More information will appear in a pop-up. The description pop-up box may also include URLs to publications, legislations or websites. You need to anchor the pop-up to be able to click on the URL. Do this by **clicking** on the event:

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In 2015, the Higher Education Support Amendment (VET FEE HELP Reform) Act 2015 was passed to include reforms to the VET FEE-HELP. These reforms targeted rogue training providers and provided protection to students taking out VET FEE-HELP loans.																	
From 1 January 2016, amendments to the Higher Education Support Act strengthened requirements of the scheme, including the introduction of a minimum of three fee periods per course and entry procedures to ensure students were academically suited to diploma-level study.
